It's been another week and another batch of amazing Android apps and games ready to download. There's a large dose of communication apps this week, and a healthy mix of action, strategy and physics games to dig into. Tilt 2 Live: Gauntlet's Revenge is the latest iteration in an excellent action series. Instead of getting stuck in a static arena and having to tilt the device around incoming enemies and to power-ups, you have to work through a constantly scrolling stage, similar to an endless runner. Collect the blue cubes as best you can without getting hit. Take too many hits and it's game over. The finely configured gyroscope controls make the game very tense and fast-paced. Darkness Reborn Darkness Reborn is a beautifully rendered two-cell action-RPG. Deploy a number of deadly techniques to take on the forces of darkness, upgrade your equipment, and once you are satisfied with a single game campaign, take the fight online to the player vs. game matches. You can also get along with your buddies to take on some really wild bosses if you think you have sand for it. The graphics are particularly fantastic, and the over-the-top action has its own special charm. Free, IAPs - Download Now Kingdom Rush: The Origin of the Classic Tower Defense Game is back, and even than ever. Kingdom Rush: Origins goes back to the chronology of fantasy stories when it all started, but to be honest, the players are really into this for finely tuned gameplay strategy, and goofy cartoon graphics style. Protect against waves of monsters, collect their gold, and level your defensive structures to take on big threats. Let too much through the glove and it's game over. Most of the towers will be familiar, although the old artillery tower has been replaced by the Druid. There are new heroes to control, including an assortment of premium ones, although the characters now have their own signature spells to unleash. The gem system is still in place for expendable bonuses, and the heroic and iron versions challenge each level to give you some real challenging stages to chew on. Strategy fans will get sucked back into Kingdom Rush: Origins. Be sure to check out the predecessor, Frontiers, if you haven't already. Turbo Dismount Creators of classic flash games Stair Dismount and Truck Dismount have continued their legacy with a new name called Turbo Dismount. As before, you attach the unfortunate dummy crash tests to different types of vehicles and run them from ramps, over rocks and explosives to cause as much bodily harm and destruction as possible. Each run is carefully assessing the damage and quickly resets so you can change the position and change the steering and speed. New levels, vehicles and obstacles can be nabbed through in-app purchases. Free, IAPs - Download now Banner Saga Banner Saga Saga is a highly polished tale chock full of Norse mythology. Help the two caravans survive in a sunless world, as well as negotiating weak relationships between humans, giants and numerous factions between them. Go between meaningful dialogue sessions and take turns dealing with 25 different characters covering five classes. Failure in battle leaves long-term results for the rest of the game. The artistic style of only the Banner Saga is enough to pick it up, but it also strikes a great balance between a strong, character-driven story and classic RPG-style action. This is a premium game without in-app purchases, but on the other hand, there is no immersive mode. Super! Super is a fun, lighthearted image-sharing network with editing tools that allow you to slap captions and stickers on photos. You can answer and like the pictures on your timeline, but the catch that all the answers are also photos. Signatures all start with one of the few preset lines, not unlike the poetry of the refrigerator, and are polished with a custom signature. Set the background with any of the included designs, shoot yourself with the camera, or look for something specific from the app. While not difficult, Super has a distinctive style, and a format with great creativity. You can still communicate with groups via Facebook Messenger, but the dedicated groups app can help you communicate without getting involved in your usual timeline content. Learn more. Some of the hottest debates in the Star Wars fan community have focused on the many changes that George Lucas and his team have made to the saga over the years. While some actually make sense for the story and continuity of the films, others are just so head-scratching unnecessary that adding them weakens the impact of movies and artistry. Here are seven of the most famous examples of changes in the Star Wars series, including some that have angered fans the most. 1. Who shot first? Harrison Ford and Greedo in Star Wars: A New Hope Lucasfilm The most famous of the changes in the saga, it forever changed the confrontation between Han Solo and Greedo in Mos Eisley cantina. Initially, Khan took out Rodian the bounty hunter just minutes before he had the opportunity to blow it up or deliver it to Jabba the Hutt. However, Lucas apparently felt that the scene made Khan - one of the characters - too bloodthirsty. So, in the 1997 special edition, Khan was made into a digital duck shot shot at Greedo just a minute before he shoots his own blaster (above). The result looked ridiculous, and while further tinkering is now Khan and Greedo shoot around the same time

(still with Han diving), the damage was done. 2. Introducing Jabba the Hutt Harrison Ford and Jabba the Hutt in Star Wars: A New Hope Lucasfilm Poor Han Solo appears in another change to a new hope. Moments after Greedo pulled Greedo out to prevent a clash with Jabba, Khan has a face-to-face conversation with gangster Hutt in a remote scene that was added to the film's special edition. In addition to his repetitive dialogue from the Grido scene, the fact that Jabba was not yet developed when the scene was first shot meant that Khan was forced to bypass (or, in this case, the tail of a character similar to a bullet). The CGI used for this moment (as well as Jabba in general) looked false compared to his appearance in Return of the Jedi. Again, the visuals were ultimately fixed (see above), but the scene really had to end up on the cutting room floor anyway. 3. Death Star's Ring of Fire in Star Wars: A New Hope by Lucasfilm Apparently, Lucas felt that the destruction of The Death Star Luke was not epic or satisfying enough for the audience as it was. For a special edition fiery rings were added to the explosions of the Death Star at the end of New Hope and return of the Jedi (not to mention the fate of Alderaan). While the image may be seen as more cinematic, it creates repetitive repetitive an effect that ultimately adds little more than a flourish in an already dramatic moment. Perhaps Lucas just wanted to borrow the idea from another well-known sci-fi property, as this blast ring became known as the Praxis effect for its use in Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country. 4. Luke Mark Hamill's Scream: The Empire Strikes Back Lucasfilm After the shocking show that Darth Vader is his father, Luke chooses to avoid the only way he knows how: letting himself fall from Vader's clutches. The special edition added to the cry while Luke's body falls, reusing the same audio that viewers hear when Palpatine meets his demise. The sound certainly doesn't match the moment or character, not least because Luke probably won't scream during his deliberate fall. At this point, he directs the Force (as evidenced by the way his body is sent to safety). Plus, adding to such a sharp sound effect takes away the weight of his decision and, frankly, just sounds strange, given the context. Fortunately, Luke's cry was removed in all subsequent releases. 5. Jedi Rocks Star Wars: Return of the Jedi Lucasfilm At the beginning of return of the Jedi, the audience is taken to Jabba's Palace, where carbonite-clad Khan is held. Before Luke arrives and the action kicks in, vocalist Sy Snootles performs a song called Lapti Nek, but the special edition replaces this extended musical number called Jedi Rocks, in which Sy Snootles finds himself through CGI and participates in a brief duet. Both Snutles and Yuzzum, with whom she performs, even break the fourth wall at one point. While the new scene has smoother visuals, the over-the-top sequence has a strange tonal shift from its predecessor, distracting from the dark atmosphere of Jabba's palace and the gruesome death of dancer Twi'lek that intertwines with. 6. Vader says no (again) David Prowse in Star Wars: Return of the Jedi Lucasfilm Fans bristled when, upon learning of Padme's death in Revenge of the Sith, Vader screamed out a loud no, crushing various droids and medical equipment nearby in the process. Despite this, Lucas repeated the moment Vader watches his son suffer at the hands of Emperor Palpatine and then push his master down the reactor shaft in return of the Jedi. Most likely, Lucas intended that the callback had a certain symmetrical poetry, as he often compares the saga with a musical composition full of parallels and connections. However, the added dialogue destroys what was originally a quiet moment of reflection and decisive action, as Vader cannot stand by and let his son die. 7. Young Anakin as the ghost of the Force Hayden Christensen, Ioda and Alec Guinness in star wars: Return of the Jedi Ending Lucasfilm Return of the Jedi to be the culmination of a six-hour saga that sees Anakin finally reach redemption and become one of them with the Force. The question of how he manages to do so has not been answered, but The film's editions replaced actor Sebastian Shaw - who plays Anakin moments before his death aboard the Death Star - with prequels Hayden Christensen. If the older version of the character is the one who helped to balance himself, why does his ghost of the Force appear as his younger self? Why isn't Obi-Wan young? Also, will Luke even recognize his father's 20-something version? This change raises too many unnecessary questions when the original was completely effective.
