Verb Tenses are all used to express actions that have taken place in the past, present and future. The following sections will show how and when to use the 12 main times in English grammar. The present simple is used to express common truths, while present continuous time describes the actions taking place now. Real simple tension is used to refer to current habits, while present continuous tension is used to express annoying habits (I always do). The present simple time expresses the event schedule; continuous time is used to describe future arrangements. The present simple is used to refer to permanent states; in contrast, real continuous voltage is used to express temporal states. Real Simple vs. Present Continuous Tenses Chart Picture Present Perfect vs. Present Perfect Progressives Learn the difference between present-sing and present perfect continuous tension in English. This ideal voltage is used with off-the-shelf action, while the real perfect progressive voltage is used with unfinished action. The real ideal time points to constant action; the real perfect progressive tension describes temporary actions. This ideal tension emphasizes the result of the action; in contrast, this ideal progressive tension emphasizes the duration of action. The present ideal time points to how much /How much, while the present perfect progressive tension indicates how long something is going on. Real Perfection vs. Present Perfect Progressive (en) Tenses Chart Picture Past Simple vs Present Perfects What's the Difference Between Past Simple and Present Perfect Tense? A simple time has passed to express the finished time; in contrast, the present ideal time describes the unfinished time. The past simple time is used to refer to a certain time, while the present perfect time refers to an uncertain time. The past simple time indicates a number of ready-made actions or re- actions; real ideal tension expresses experience or result. Past Simple vs. Present Perfection Tenses Chart Picture Past Perfect vs. Past Perfect Continuous. What's the Difference Between Past Perfect and Perfect Continuous Time Past? The past perfect time expresses the past action, already finished when there was another past action; past perfect uninterrupted time describes the past action, which began in the past and continued to occur after another action or time in the past. The past perfect time highlights the results of past activities; in contrast, the past's perfect uninterrupted time emphasizes the duration of activities in the past. Past time shows two events in the past that are related, while the past's perfect continuous tension shows the cause of past action. Tenses Picture Chart will be against Going to English Tenses Learn the difference between Will vs Going in English time with grammatical rules and examples. In English grammar of time, both Will and Be Going to are used to express the future of time, but they do not same value. Will is used to express future actions taken at the time of the speech, while Going to describes plans for the future, decided before the performance. Will is used to refer to a prediction based on personal opinions or experiences, while going is used to express a prediction based on evidence. Will express the future fact; going used to describe something about to happen.
